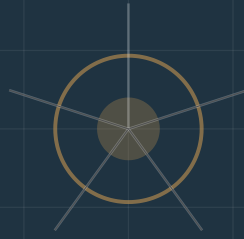

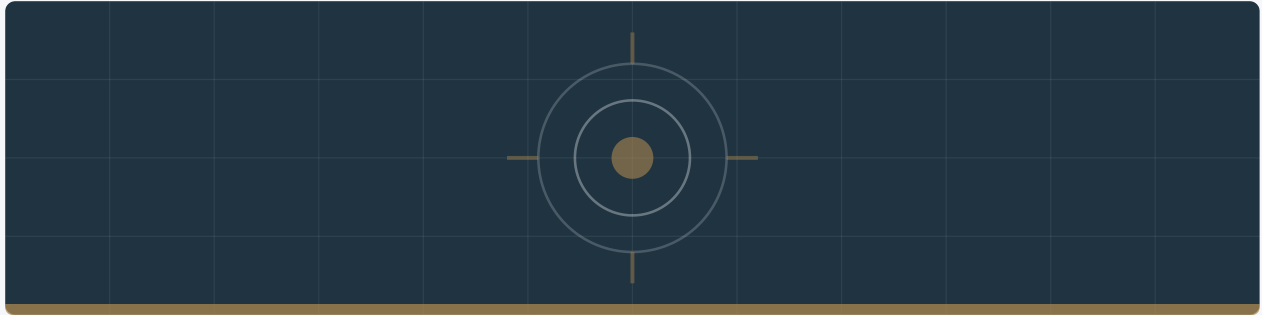

Organizations with weak visibility often experience:

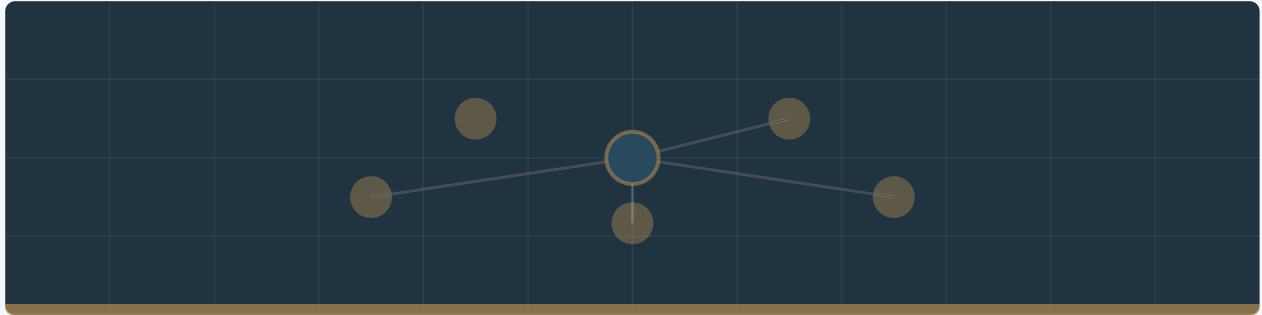
- Fragmented information systems

This occurs when:

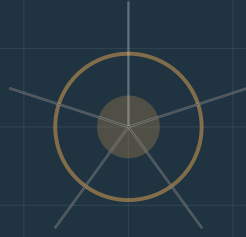
- Systems are disconnected

Organizations with strong Institutional Intelligence are able to:

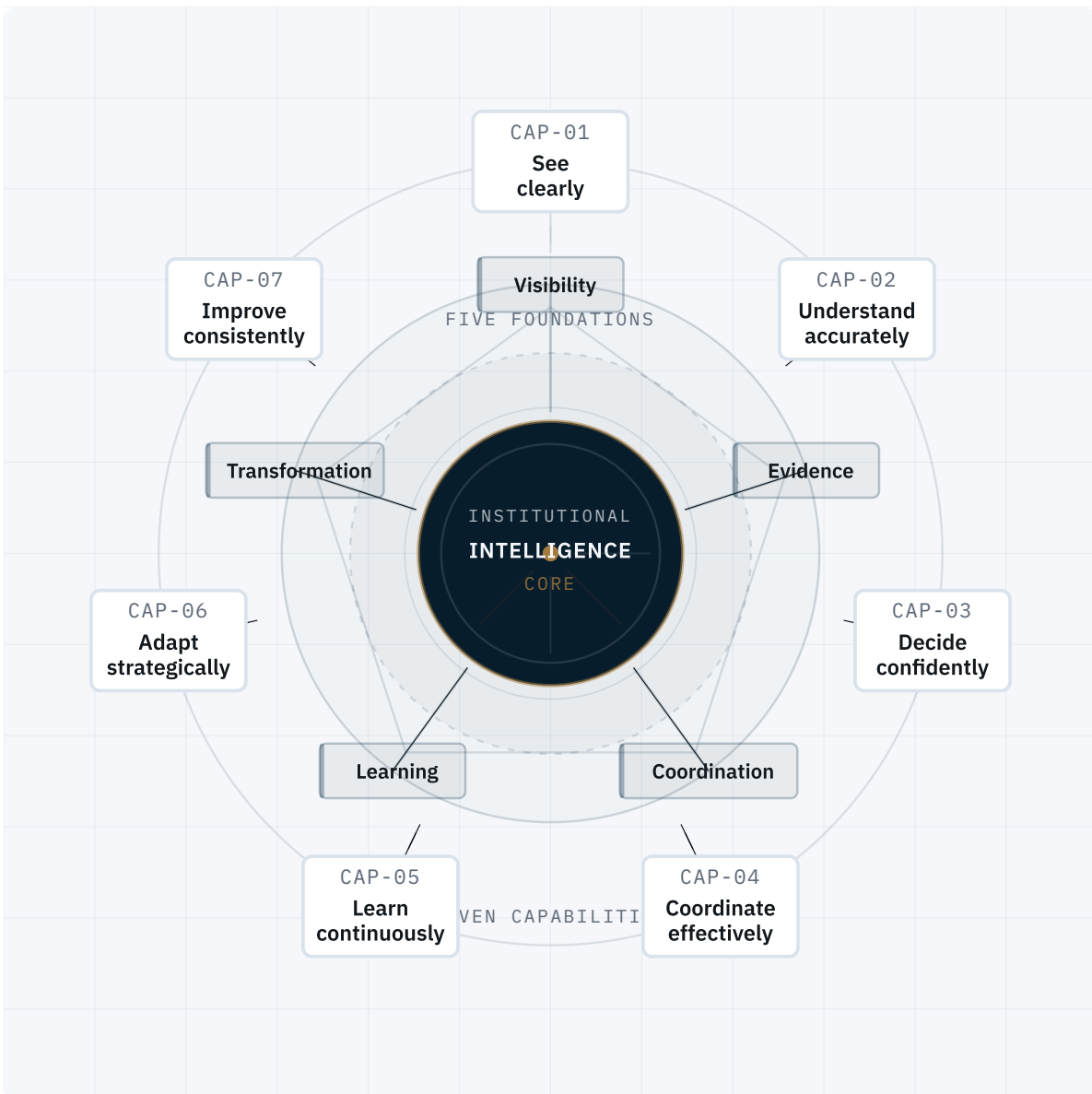
- See clearly

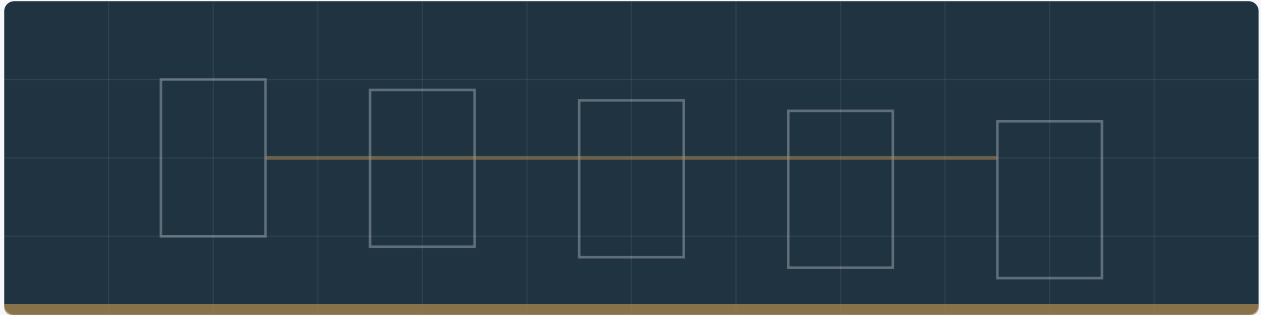
### Institutional Intelligence Capabilities

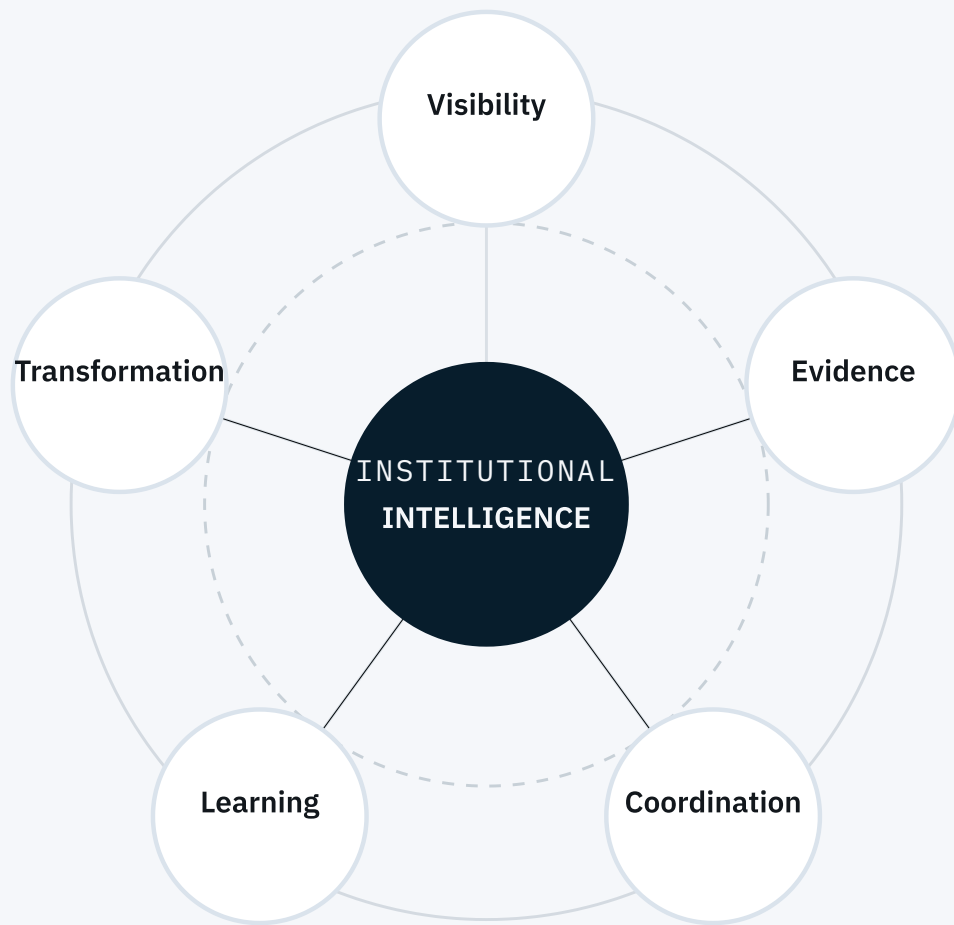

### Learning

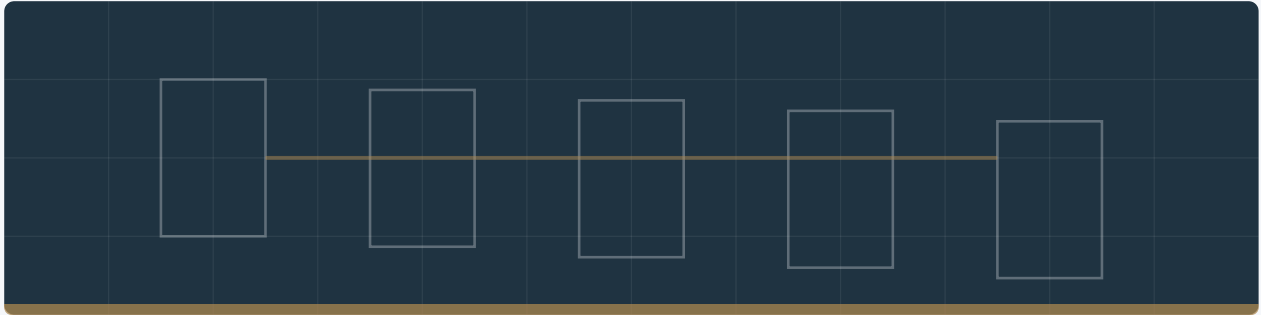
The ability to improve through reflection and adaptation.

**Impact**

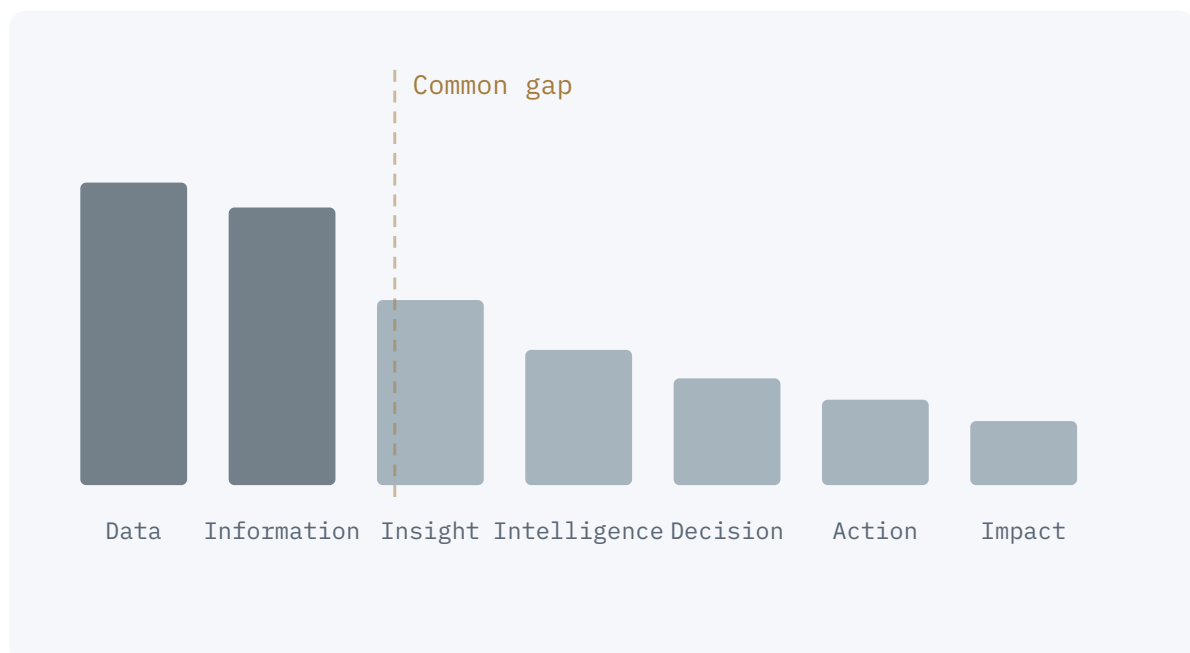
Observable changes resulting from action.

The Intelligence Stack provides a framework for identifying and addressing these gaps.

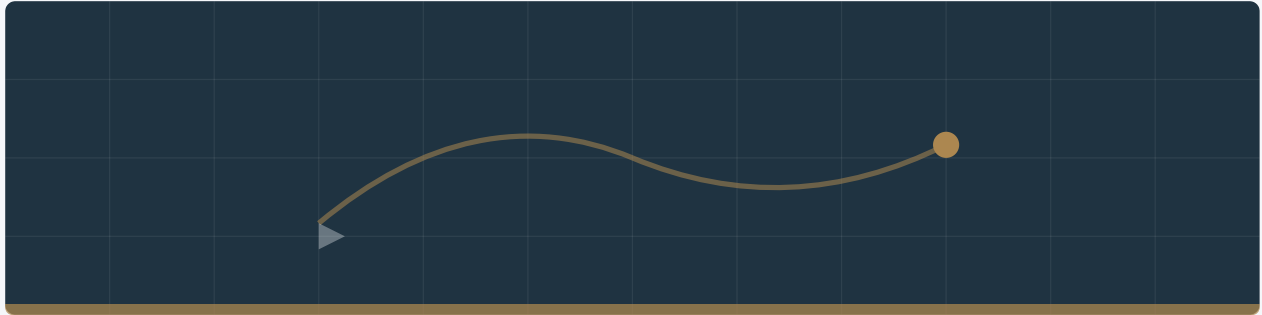

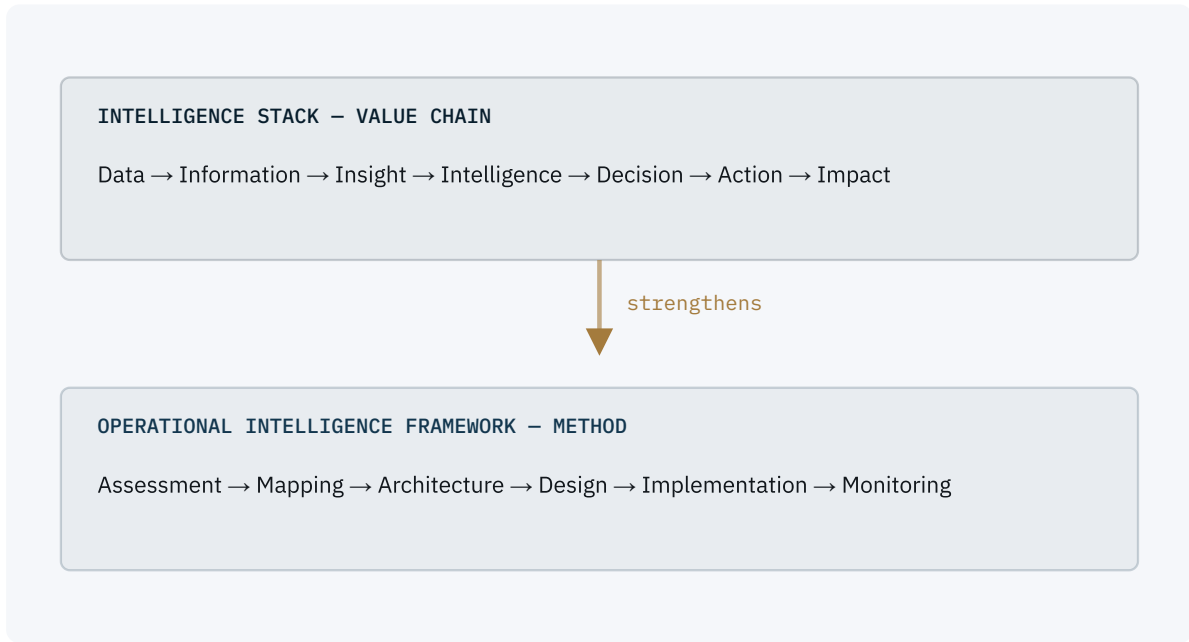

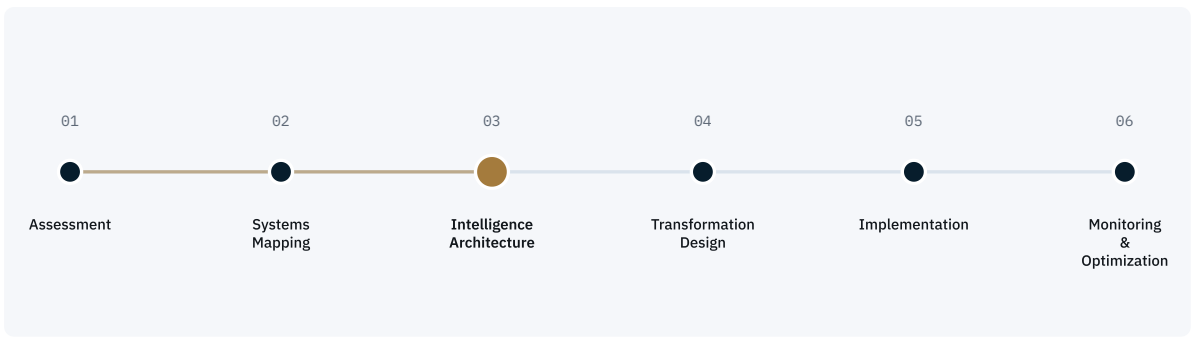
## Stack and OIF Relationship

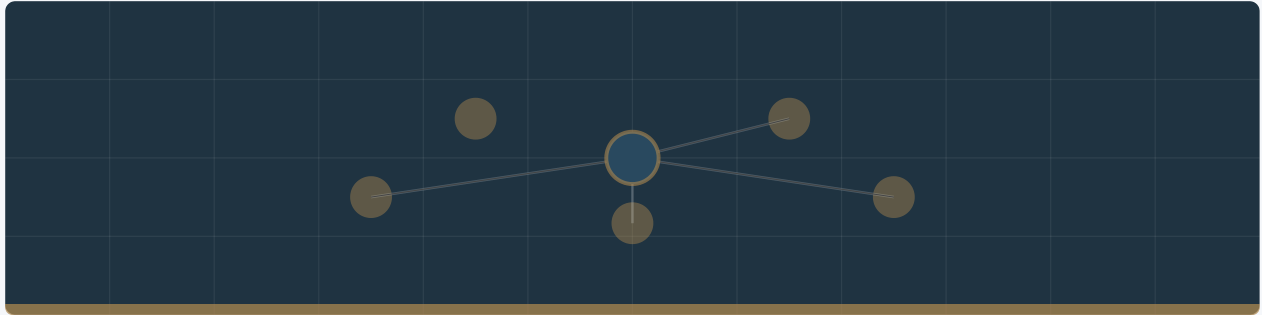

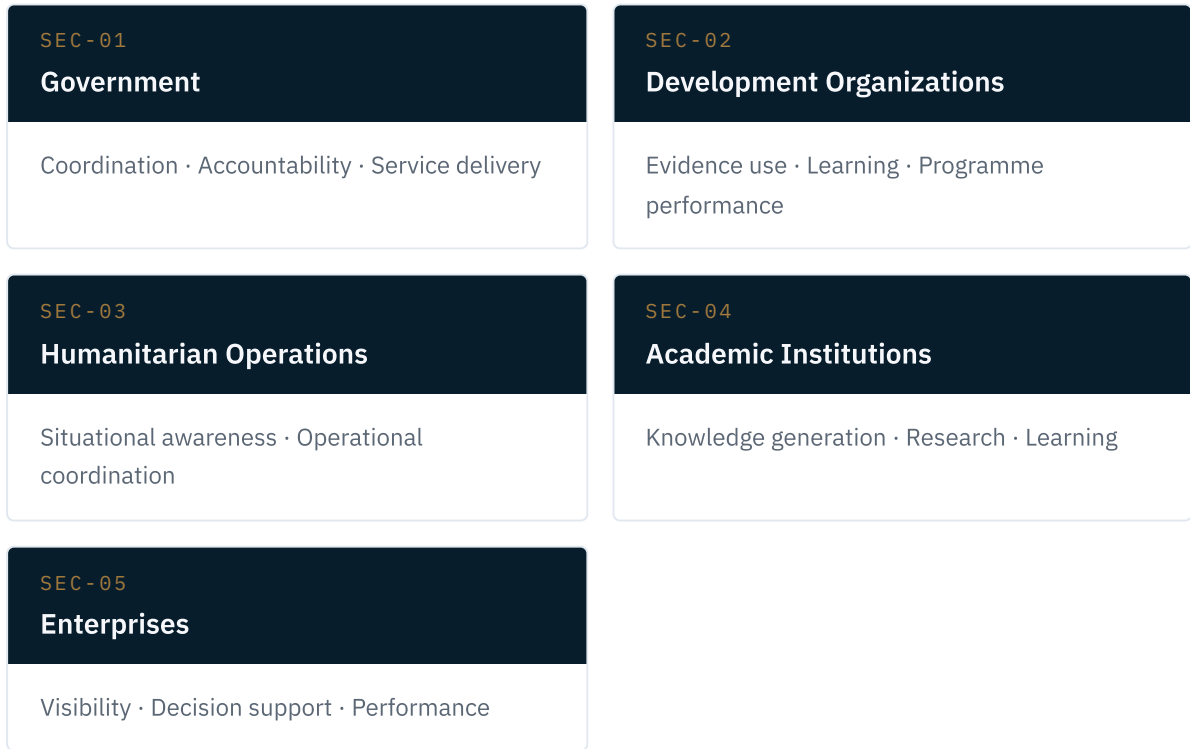

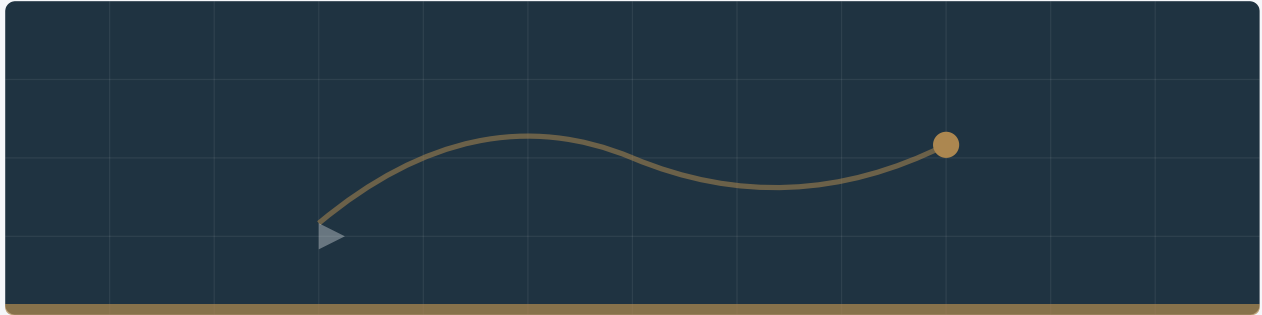
